And most of all, I want a “new normal” in which we each feel completely loved and forgiven, finding peace in our own hearts, acceptance of who we are, and real love for the child of God each one of us is.

Moravian Disaster Response (MDR) Fund Helps to Purchase Needed Seeds for Crops January 21, 2021

When Hurricanes Eta and Iota hit Nicaragua and Honduras in November 2020, they spread up to 60 inches of rain far inland in a matter of two weeks. This caused catastrophic flooding along the creeks and rivers that provide water and transportation for the many villages that line them. This flooding destroyed many of the farming plots that provide food for each of these communities, leaving as much as two feet of mud and sand on them. The current crops were destroyed, and after hard work they are now ready for the next planting.

Thankfully with the funds donated to the Board of World Mission's Disaster Response Fund, seeds were purchased and distributed to many of these villages so that the next crop of beans can begin to bear fruit in a few months. This will go a long way towards providing these Moravian brothers and sisters with a predictable food source well into the future.

To date, the Board of World Mission has dispatched \$130,000 to the three Moravian Provinces in the region to help them procure not only these seeds but other needed food and supplies and the ability to clean out village wells which were contaminated by the flooding



What we have sent so far is a good start, but more is needed. A sack of seeds for beans costs about \$60. Won't you consider helping?

We ask for your continued support of the Moravian Disaster Response fund, which allows the BWM to respond to disasters immediately with funds for emergency needs, as well as ongoing rebuilding projects.

The pictures included are of the distribution of seeds along the lower Rio Coco, which is the river that forms the border between Nicaragua and Honduras.





This year, without an end yet, the board has decided to not hold our weekly dinner and discussion. It was not an easy decision to make, but we felt it necessary at this time. However, we will be honoring Lent on Sundays. This year, Pastor Katie will be preaching a sermon series during Lent. What is a sermon series? It is several sermons based on the same theme or topic that may tell a story, share an idea or build weekly upon one another. The theme for Lent 2021 is "Called to More: A Lenten Series on Wrestling with Sin."

KIDS.....You are NOT forgotten!

We will once again have children's bulletins available for kids during worship. We encourage youth to come to church and be part of our service, even if they make noise. We love a joyful noise to the Lord! We know it has not been easy and we continue to figure out ways to keep kids active in faith. So here are some ideas to "do church" even without our regular activities...

1. **Find God Scenes...** Look out your window, watch around you, name different ways you see/experience God.
2. **Questions for Heaven...** make a list of all the stuff you want God to answer. Why does a Dalmatian have spots or who created God. It is amazing what young minds can come up with. Can you get to ten or even 20 questions. Look up Chris Rice's music entitled "questions for heaven" after you finish and see if he adds any questions to your list.
3. **Send a letter!** Have you ever had a pen-pal? Church folks make great pen pals! Pick a name from the directory and create a card or write a letter. Who knows, you may even get one back!
4. **Memorize a Bible verse.** Want to know the shortest Bible verse..."Jesus Wept" (John 11:35). Can you find the longest? Can you find one about butterflies or sparrows? You can search lots of scripture around different words you know. Find one and make a habit of saying it a few times a day. By the end of the week you may even know more than one verse!
5. **Do the "trade up" game.** How much can you get by trading up? For example, get something small and simple (pencil) and ask a parent to trade something more valuable. Keep doing this by asking more people, gaining more value as you go along. Can you trade something that you could sell? Give the money to the charity of your choice. (Someone on the internet is doing this game and at last report, had a snowboard).
6. **Read an inspiring book other than your Bible.** God speaks through many voices, not just scripture. Try and find another book (or song or poem) that you feel God speaking through. Share with a parent or friend why this message is from God.
