





What do Moravians believe about....

This is such a tough question to answer. The beauty and challenge of the Moravian Church is that we do not have hard and fast rules about a lot of things. But then, when it comes to the tough topics, we don't have

hard and fast rules. So when someone asks what do Moravians believe about homosexuality, gender identity, legalization of marijuana, illegal immigration, veganism, the war in Israel and Ukraine...the answers are varied. We don't say that one lifestyle, one belief, one way is the only way, although some of us do. We don't say this is right or wrong, but some do. We don't say we support one side or the other, but some do. We don't say we are all one political party, one belief system, one understanding....we don't. The simple truth is Moravians don't agree on a lot. We don't agree on who should be president of the US, who we should love, who should make decisions, how government should be run, what are the "correct" ways of living, etc. But there are a few things we do agree on.

We agree that Jesus Christ is our Lord. We agree there is one God (although what forms and names vary). We agree that all are loved by God. We agree that all are important, deserve respect and care, no matter what label, background or identity. We know that there is nobody God doesn't love, even if there are people we struggle to love. We know that we don't know everything and therefore allow space for others. We welcome all to our tables.

I recently sat with some folks from other churches who discussed some challenges and wondered why there are so many denominations and why people can't just be welcomed at the table, everyone. I agreed with their statements, knowing full well the churches these folks attend do not ordain women. I then listened as one shared that their church will not collect items for people they cannot "share the gospel with." This includes food, clothing, personal items. They will not collect them physically, because they cannot share the gospel. But doesn't the gospel say, when you fed me and when you clothed me. It made my heart hurt. There are churches that will not collect item for our most vulnerable if they cannot "share the gospel," which to me, means tell them what Jesus means and have them accept there understanding of faith. It hurts my heart. You would rather have children go hungry because you cannot "minister to them," rather than collect and give, freely. I am so grateful that in all the times that Jesus met with everyone, he never once said, you must listen to me first, you must believe my message first, you must proclaim me as God first, then I will heal, feed, clothe, listen. Never, never in all of Jesus' ministry, did he ever require proper belief, faith or understanding in order to help, heal or give hope. Never. Ministry is not about believing the right things or saying the right things, it is about doing what's right...feeding, clothing, visiting, caring, healing. Although I am a preacher, preaching is not on the list of what you must do for others. Love, serve, heal, reach out, respect, care... it isn't about sharing a message, but living the message. So, every Monday, we minister at Loaves and Fishes, even if we never say a word....we share the Gospel.

Lent: Are You 'The Chosen?'




Have you watched the series "The Chosen" just yet? It is based upon scripture, but definitely takes
