If you are not on the internet, call the church office and Pastor Katie can get you on the list or mark down an item you wish to bring.




Keep On Keeping On!

Thanks to the generosity of our churches, local grocery stores, individuals and community, we received an abundance of donations and were able to alternate bags of food and gift cards. Alternating, families received a bag of food then a gift card, then food, etc. We were even able to provide a fresh item in the food bags.

A small number of volunteers worked for a few hours to load bags of food ready for three different weeks. All of the food we used was nonperishable and stored safely, so the only addition was the fresh item. Through good communication and some virtual meetings, the group was able to finish the school year feeding all of the families.

We have received many thank yous and continue to receive donations. The group is even looking at helping other community ministries like Sandwiches in the Park, who continue to feed our local community.

Dear Colleagues and Friends of the Western District:

I hope you all are staying safe and healthy. I write to you today to share with you the news that the Camping Ministry Committee today made the very difficult decision to cancel our Western District, Western Region summer church camps. Specifically, this would include Minndy, 4-M, Junior Camp, Winmor, and Chetek. Please note that our Mid-States camps (Tar Hollow, Illiana, and Bethany Junior Camp) have not yet made a final decision on their summer camps.

Your Western Region camp directors are working on alternatives for camp this year. These may include, but not be limited to, a virtual gathering of camp aged students and staff, perhaps doing a one-day socially-distanced camp event for families at Mt. Morris, or getting some camp-themed materials through email and/or snail mail. If you would normally be coming to camp this year, we encourage you to contact your camp director (www.wdcamping.org) and they can let you know what alternative plans they may be working on.

The decision to cancel our camps at Mt. Morris this year obviously puts a huge financial strain on Mt. Morris Camp and Retreat Center. I would encourage you as a congregation and as individuals to be thinking of ways that you could support Mt. Morris financially (www.mt-morris.org]. The Western District has decided to funnel the money that would normally have been used for Western District Western Region camp vouchers to go to Mt. Morris. Perhaps your local church would want to consider money that had been raised for local church camp scholarships to be sent to Mt. Morris so that we can still have our camps there next year. Or, if you have money in an endowment fund that is normally earmarked for camp scholarships perhaps it could go to Mt. Morris. We would encourage whatever governing board responsible for camp oversight to consider this. Even if your congregation does not normally send children to camp, perhaps this is the year you could make a special individual or congregational gift to Mt. Morris.

Please stay tuned as our camp directors share more definitive plans for other opportunities for our children to gather this summer. Please be in prayer for our camping program this summer.


