## "It is Well... With My Should..."

How is your soul these days? Is it hopeful of days returning to the past? Is it hurting through sadness of our brothers and sisters who still experience racism on a regular basis? Is it concerned over the pandemic and its impact on the world, especially our most vulnerable? Is it relieved and thankful for our area that is not heavily burdened with death? How is your soul, today?

Before March, many of us were continuing our days as "usual" with work, school, family, life. Then March came and everything stopped, including our sense of security. We had not realized that our security was a privilege, one that could be taken away at a moment's notice. But that is exactly what happened, we went from healthy and safe to a world in which a hug could kill you. It doesn't feel safe or secure. It doesn't feel natural to see masks and use hand sanitizer more than ever. When everything happened, many community leaders gathered together with the Mayor of Watertown and we checked in with one another. My favorite, was hearing from the hospital administrator. He looked at everyone in the room and said "we got this, we are ready to handle this." I will not forget those words. We have not heard that very often over the past few months. We don't hear the news of perseverance and control, we don't hear that things will be ok and we will get through this. Instead, we hear lots of fear, frustration and the unknown. I get that the news cannot guarantee our safety and it is important to be well-informed. But sometimes, we need he reminders, we got this.

Faith plays a big part of that. Maybe even our faith had some shaky ground when we could not meet and when we saw the horrible toll in Italy and NYC. We may have wondered where is God or at least how did God let this happen. As we have watched the spread, the news, the government, we have not heard those words we so desperately need...we got this. So, brothers and sisters, I want you to read it here. I want you to know that for thousand of years there have been illnesses and viruses. There have been plagues and destruction. We have lived in a safe bubble that we were not aware and the bubble has burst. But God has not. God has not left us nor is punishing us. Instead, God is with us, reminding us, even in those dark days, we got this. Thank you God, for being the voice that we seldom hear, but that matters the most. And thank you for reminding us, through all of life, through a pandemic, through loss and fear, through isolation, through the unknown, through literally everything, we got this...by your grace and strength. Amen

## Western District Synod Postponed



Every four years, district synods are held to elect the leadership of the district, report ministries over the years and make decisions to guide our district churches. Originally, the Western District Synod was scheduled at the end of April at Mt. Morris. Our representatives elected at our church council are Theresa Vesper, Joe Walsh and Pastor Katie.

The synod has been postponed until November 19 - 22. Please be in prayer for the leadership of our district and province. All district synods have been changes, which will definitely cause more challenges and disruptions. We continue to pray for the leadership of our churches on all levels and for all those who continue to support through this difficult time.

## SOS FREE SCHOOL SUPPLIES

The Shared Community Mission Group (eleven churches in Watertown committed to outreach assistance for children and families) will again distribute free school supplies. This year free school supplies will be handed out at the parking lot of St Henry Parish Center, 300 East Cady Street on Tuesday August 18, 2020.

We will serve children enrolled in grades 4K through High School. You must be pre-registered to pick up school supplies. This year due to the covid-19 pandemic we are doing a touchless drive thru distribution where grade specific bags of school supplies will be distributed.

Beginning Monday August 3 through Friday August 14 you can register for the SOS Free School Supplies at the following churches: Christ United Methodist Church, Ebenezer and Watertown Moravian Church; St Bernard and St Henry Catholic Churches; First Congregational-UCC; River City Church; River Valley Alliance Church; Good Shepherd Lutheran; Immanuel Lutheran Church and St Paul's Episcopal Church.

You can also register at the following programs: Loaves and Fishes Supper at Watertown Moravian Church Monday evening; Summer Sandwiches in the Park on Tuesdays 11:30-12:30 at Christ United Methodist Church; Summer Sandwiches in the Park on Wednesdays at Good Shepherd (11:30am to 12:30pm); Summer Sandwiches in the Park on Friday at Watertown Moravian (11:30 to 12:30); Food Pantry; Mary's Room on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and at the Watertown Food Pantry at Immanuel Ev. Lutheran church.

### HOW TO REGISTER FOR FREE SCHOOL SUPPLIES

- You must fill out the top and bottom half of the registration form. A volunteer will sign the form. The bottom half is for you to keep. It will have your appointment time to pick up free school supplies.  
**YOU NEED TO BRING THE REGISTRATION FORM WITH YOU.**
- **School supplies will be given out at St. Henry Parish Center, 300 East Cady Street, Watertown, WI 53094**
- **On Tuesday August 18 go to St. Henry's Parish parking lot:** enter from Cady Street for one-way drive thru. **Give us your part of the registration form and we will give you a bag of school supplies for each registered child in your family. We will bring the supplies to your car.**
- **(Note: if you are walking please wear a face mask at the pick-up table if possible)**
- Please do not come before your appointment time- we will not give you the supplies early. You may come after your scheduled time. There are appointments from 9:00 to 4:00. We will be handing out supplies to registered guests until 5:00 pm.

## STAMP OUT HUNGER FOOD DRIVE

The nation's largest food drive re-emerges with a whole new look. During this time of Covid19 you might be wondering what will be happening in the future for the Food Pantry. Originally the annual Postal Food Drive normally held the second Saturday in May was postponed to either August or September. With no immediate end in sight for this pandemic, the National Association of Letter Carriers has developed a new plan to address the problem of hunger.

All the nation's food pantries, as well as ours here in Watertown continue to be willing to work with the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC). The result is a "virtual" food drive created to fit the current circumstances facing us all. A website has been created for this express purpose.

Every dollar raised will go directly to our food pantry so we can purchase food for the hungry. By selecting the Watertown Food Pantry as the recipient of your donation, you are assured that all food purchased will be for our food pantry to help residents in the City of Watertown and surrounding rural area residing in the Watertown School District.

**"Harriet"** From her escape from slavery through the dangerous missions she led to liberate hundreds of slaves through the Underground Railroad, the story of heroic abolitionist Harriet Tubman is told.

**"The Hate U Give"** Starr Carter is constantly switching between two worlds -- the poor, mostly black neighborhood where she lives and the wealthy, mostly white prep school that she attends. The uneasy balance between these worlds is soon shattered when she witnesses the fatal shooting of her childhood best friend at the hands of a police officer. Facing pressure from all sides of the community, Starr must find her voice and decide to stand up for what's right.

**"The Green Book"** Dr. Don Shirley is a world-class African-American pianist, who is about to embark on a concert tour in the Deep South in 1962. In need of a driver and protection, Shirley recruits Tony Lip, a tough-talking bouncer from an Italian-American neighborhood in the Bronx. Despite their differences, the two men soon develop an unexpected bond while confronting racism and danger in an era of segregation.

### **"Just Mercy"**

After graduating from Harvard, Bryan Stevenson heads to Alabama to defend those wrongly condemned or those not afforded proper representation. One of his first cases is that of Walter McMillian, who is sentenced to die in 1987 for the murder of an 18-year-old girl, despite evidence proving his innocence. In the years that follow, Stevenson encounters racism and legal and political maneuverings as he tirelessly fights for McMillian's life.
