
Yet the world is still the same, just things around us are changing. Those who we love are still the same, our jobs, titles, status, all the same. Our pets do not change their behavior and our houses are still where they are, perhaps with an adjustment of the thermostat. Things around us changing doesn't mean we have. Changing appearances on the outside, doesn't change the inside. Trees still produce the same leaves and fruits and seeds even if the colors on them have turned. They still have the same insects burrowing and birds nesting, perhaps with a few less eggs.

So often, we mistakenly think that changes on the outside mean the same as on the inside. But they don't. When a person loses a lot of weight, they look very different, but it does not mean a new personality, new values or new identities. It simply means a change in appearance. And yes, there are people who do change with appearance changes just like there are people who change internally without any outward change. Appearance does not mean different in any way except clothing style, looks, pronouns or names. Whether you prefer James or Jim, Kristina or Kris, Michelle or Shelly doesn't mean any difference in who you are.

I have spent my entire life defending that my full name is Katie, not Katherine, not Katelyn not anything else, simply Katie. And my kids have done the opposite, reminded everyone that they do not go by their full names, but by their chosen nicknames, Annie and Zeeg. They are still my kids and I am still their mother. So whether they dress like a Halloween character or a character from Little House on the Prairie, it does not change how smart, funny, empathetic, energetic, helpful, resourceful or anything else about who they

And just as we delight in the colors of fall, I pray that we delight in however people change. I pray that we remember although we might not understand the outside changes (not exactly sure the process for leaf changing either), we can still just enjoy the person we know and love on the inside. We teach our kids that it is what on the inside that matters, may we live that in our daily lives as we strive to see the inside beauty of everyone.

We never know just how many bags we will have to fill, so the more soup we can collect, the better. Even if it is not one of the varieties listed, we will give it out, so bring it in.

Our first day to pack food is Thursday, October 20th at 12:30. We need 3 or 4 volunteers to be at Christ United Methodist Church on Hall Street and pack bags. It usually takes about 45 minutes.

The book has not been chosen yet, so if you have suggestions, please pass them along to Pastor Katie. Watch our FB Page and bulleting for the new book chosen.






