What's in a name?

Good question. My full name is Katie Ruth Van Der Linden and my whole life I have had to correct folks who call me by my "real name." Apparently anyone named Katie must actually be named Katherine or Kathleen, but I am quick to point out that I am "just Katie." I do appre-

ciate my name as it is from two great grandparents, both of whom were nicknamed Katie. One had a German name and the other Hungarian, but chose to go by a simpler name, Katie. Instead of choosing one full name over the other, my parents chose to go by the nickname that both women had chosen. I love that story. It tells of my heritage and my connection to generations past. I never met either of these women, but somehow I still feel a connection. Names matter and are important because they are who we are, our identity. I remember when I was getting married and having the discussion about taking on Aaron's name and the challenge that was, not only because I was the last person in my family with my maiden name, but also because I would be my mother-in-law...Mrs. Van Der Linden. I chuckle about it now, but it mattered.

Nobody wants to be called something or someone they are not. For my entire life, my step-dad has been called "Magee." No, it is not the name he was given nor is it on any legal documentation, but as a child and a story-teller, he was quickly nicknamed "Fibber Magee" after a popular character at the time. It stuck, and 60 years later, he is still Magee. He isn't ashamed or saddened when folks call him the name he was given, but he does share that he prefers his nickname. So what? Does it matter? Should he be forced to go by Jerry, his legal name? Right now we have a lot of folks who are questioning their identities and trying out new names. So? Is it the end of the world to go from Richard to Rich or from Richard to Sue? I get that it may feel uncomfortable or even wrong. And your feelings are valid. However, your feelings do not supersede the other person's identity. As we grow, we get to choose who we are. I know Bobby's who are now Roberts, Timmy's who are now Tim, and Roger's who are now Jessica. In the end, what someone chooses to be called is their own choice. Nicknames were not questioned before, so why now? And I understand that nicknames may feel different than gender changes and style choices, but in the end of the day, when you lay your head on your pillow, it really doesn't matter if you accepted someone else's change. It simply matters that you respected someone enough to let them be them. Let God sort out if it's right or wrong. Let God figure out what it means to change identities or genders or names. Let God sort out all these challenges and let us simply respect others enough to accept them as they are. I know it is challenging and I know it is not easy and I especially pray for those parents who are struggling with their children's choices. But I will say, a parent who loves their child through these difficulties will have a much healthier child than one who forces, threatens or neglects how a child feels. Yes, it can be a phase. Just like a little kid is a dinosaur, this could be a phase too. But just as you let a little kid dress up like a pterodactyl, you might just do better letting your child dress as they feel. Once a child feels supported, phases usually subside. But phase or not, allowing someone to be themselves is a true gift. Jesus met many on his travels, and he never asked them to change. I think fondly of the woman at the well who was living with a man she was not married to. Jesus never told her to move out or change, instead he gave her living water. Too often, Christians make it their mission to change others when the true understanding of faith is change in yourself. So let God sort out what others do and focus on what God is changing in you.


