What is the value in ritual?

I used to think rituals were quite boring. When no one explains the significance of an event and the process just happens, it can be confusing and slow. My first real insight into ritual was in my sorority. There were several ceremonies that we went through and each of them had a ritual, an exact process to accomplishing a task. I found it a bit boring even though we had been explained the rich history of how these rituals came to be. I did not think much of them and participated in them, but did not see a lot of value in the repetition.


I enjoy change. I enjoy things being new and different. I also enjoy predictability and situations being as I hope or expect without much change. Perhaps I am an opposite, but when it comes to fascination and thinking, I want change and unpredictability, yet when it comes to my daily life, simple and expected will do just fine.

So where does church fit in? For many years, I thought rituals were vague and repetitious. I did not find value in saying the same prayers or repeating the same steps. Yet, as I grew up, I found joy in history. This led me to realize that I had been assuming rituals were just “that’s how we have always done it” when, in fact, many were steeped in traditions dating back many, many years. Perhaps there is joy, even excitement in the ideal of following rituals.

I was born and raised ELCA Lutheran. It was not until after I graduated college that I became a Moravian. Recently, I had the opportunity to return to an ELCA service. Although I anticipated the feelings of boredom from my youth, in reality I found the rituals felt more like home. It was a strange understanding. Rituals are meant to help us feel familiarity. They are present to help us connect and feel at home. It is like grandma’s rocking chair or a favorite toy from childhood. It just makes us feel at home, where we belong.

Moravians are not as ritualistic and many other faith traditions, yet we have some very important rituals that I wish to invite you to. Holy Week readings are unique to Moravians and are part of our tradition for celebrating Easter. I invite you to come and discover the familiarity of the readings and the warm feeling from being present in history. Join us for the sunrise service, the walk to the grave, the music. Join us for Easter breakfast and the traditional service at 10am.

Remember that familiar doesn’t have to mean boring and ritual does not have to invoke the feelings of the past. Surprisingly, they can create new feelings, warm feelings, feelings of connections and a sense of belonging. This Easter, please join us, knowing this is exactly where you belong.






HOLY WEEK READINGS & SERVICES

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (April 15-17) please join us for evenings of Holy Week Readings. The Moravian Church, many years ago, compiled a set of readings that incorporates all four gospels in the retelling of the last days of Jesus' life on earth. Throughout the first days of the week, we spend time together reading through the stories. They are interspersed with songs and create a quiet and reflective time.

Thursday evening, called Maundy Thursday or "command" Thursday is the day to celebrate communion as the "command" Jesus gave to his disciples. We are reminded that Jesus broke bread with his friends and we will be invited to do the same with our church family. It is a bittersweet moment as we know what happens in the story, but at the time the disciples were simply following Passover traditions. They had no idea the lasting impact of that meal to this day.

Friday we will have a drama, creatively experiencing the Good Friday Story. This service is at 7:30 as we wish to have the sanctuary dark for the evening. All other reading services are at 7pm. Please join for any services you would like, they all are quite meaningful in various ways.

WHY DO PEOPLE LEAVE CHURCH???

It is hard to pinpoint just one reason, but the majority of people who leave and do not return, do so because nobody noticed. That is tough. At church, we wish to feel connected, a sense of belonging. Yet, if we are sick or away and nobody seems to notice or care, it makes us wonder how much we really do matter.

The Board of Elders wants to make sure everyone knows they matter. Beginning soon, we will start the 6-3-6-1-2 reconnection program. It sounds a bit confusing, but it is not too bad. Basically, the Elders want to make sure the members are being cared for. This involves checking on people we have not seen. It is so hard to return to church after an absence and it can feel awkward and uncomfortable. The Elders want to help with that too by sharing an invitation and caring reminder of your need in our faith community.

Since worship is paramount to our understanding of church, attendance pads will be available in the church pews. During the offering, members will be invited to sign the pad and pass it along to neighbors. Each week, an elder will record the attendance and a list will be made of anyone we have not seen in 6 weeks, 3 months, 6 months, 1 year and 2 years. The Elders and Pastor Katie will be contacting members to check in on them and make sure all is well. Unfortunately, with HIPPA and other challenges, the church is no longer contacted when someone is sick. It is our job to check on each other.

We hope you will embrace this new program and realize that all of God's children are important and all our Ebenezer members need to know how important they are to our church family!



CREAMY POTATO SOUP

1. 2# bag frozen hash browns (cubed)
- 2 14 oz. cans chicken broth
- 1 10.75 oz can cream of chicken soup
- 1/2 c. Chopped onion (I sautéed to make softer)
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
1. 8 oz. pkg cream cheese

Stir together and heat up broth, cream of chicken soup, pepper and onions. Add potato and cream cheese. Stir until smooth and simmer until potatoes are soft.

May add ham, bacon and/or grated cheese.

Boil chicken in water,

Chill and remove grease.

Heat and add carrots, celery, garlic, and onions.

When veggies are soft, if desired, add noodles, rice, or barley.

For a nesco of chili:

- 2 pounds hamburger
 - 4 cans beans (black, red, kidney...your choice)
 - 2 cans chili beans
 - 3/4 cup chopped celery
 - 1/2 cup chopped onion
 - 4 16oz cans diced tomatoes
 - 2 16oz cans tomato sauce
- salt, garlic, chili powder, cumin to taste but start with a tablespoon each

Brown the hamburger, open and dump all the cans into the nesco with the browned hamburger. Chop the onion and celery. Ask the rest of the team how much you need of everything. Put the onions and celery in. Add spices, and let simmer. Ask the rest of the team if it tastes right. Add more spices. Enjoy!
