There is nothing new under the sun, or at least I thought. I took my daughter to get our nails done and we were talking with the nail techs, as I have done for several months since finding this cute little nail salon. My daughter pipes up that I am a pastor and both techs asked what is that. This was a first for me. They had no idea what a pastor was and even less about church. They asked repeatedly how one gets invited and the process to be able to attend church. Several times I simply responded, you just show up. That seemed completely foreign to them. Although rare, I would bet that more people will also question what church is in the next few years. We are in a post-Christian world and more and more people are growing up without a faith community. It will no longer be simple just to invite someone to church (not that this is a simple task to begin with) but we will have to do much more explaining than we had in the past.

In August, I will be leading a three-part sermon series on Ebenezer Church and why we are here. Coincidentally, or not, a new member/refresher course will be offered after worship on those same days (August 11, 18 and 25). In these three weeks, we will not just delve into the history of our church and building, but into your own personal history. How did you get to Ebenezer? Who invited you? Why did you stay? What keeps you coming back? For many, Ebenezer is the only church you have ever known; you were literally born here. Yet for many others, you came here because someone asked or because you were searching. What were you looking for and how did you find it here?

In our first week, we will discover how you got here, what made you come into the church in the first place and whether it was worship and activity or a friendship with someone in the congregation.

As we look into how Ebenezer evolves, we will share why we stay, what keeps us coming back and what we experience as a member.

On the third Sunday, we will learn just how to invite someone to church and be reminded that we are not inviting someone to a one-time experience, but to a community that wishes to care, support and encourage. It feels so awkward for us to invite someone to our church, yet so many in our world are lacking exactly what church gives, community and love.

Please try to make each Sunday as they will build off of each other. After the series and class, we will have the opportunity to reaffirm our faith in Jesus and our commitment to Ebenezer. We will also gain valuable reminders of why we are here and what God asks of us as members. Often it is hard to invite people to church because we don't know what to say, being reminded of what others told us and what keep us coming back will be helpful in learning to share our own stories and welcome others to our church family.

**Member Reconnection Program**

The Day has Finally Arrived! On Sunday August 4th, we kick off our new "Member Reconnection Program." This program is designed to welcome people back and make sure we are caring for one another. The number one reason why people leave church is that nobody ever notices. Sadly, this is true for most churches, including Ebenezer. We do not wish for that to happen again. We know there are many people who are part of our family who do not know they are missed. We do not want a single person at Ebenezer to ever feel that they do not matter to our congregation. This program is the perfect way to remind everyone just how important they are.

Beginning on Sunday August 4th, small red notepads (pew pads) will be in each pew in church. During the offertory, those attending (members, friends, visitors) will be invited to sign the pad, which includes an area if special contact is requested. After 6 weeks, the elders will contact those who have been unable to attend church. The purpose of the call is to make sure you are well, check in and see if there is anything you need and invite you to church if you are able. The Elders hope to discover how our members are and if there are challenges to worship that we are unaware of. The more we know, the better we can serve. We look forward to connecting and making sure every member knows that he/she matter to Ebenezer Church.
