



The Art of Disagreement

I know I have said repeatedly to my children “because I said so” as an answer to the ever-popular question of “why.” As parents, we do not want our children disagreeing with us, especially over food (yes, that is what is for dinner and you will eat it) or chores (yes, you must do them or no video games) or school (yes you must go or mommy goes to jail!). However, as adults, we will disagree. That is part of our DNA, we are unique people with different ideas and opinions and will disagree. Yet, where do we learn healthy disagreements and how to have a rational discussion with someone we do not agree with? It is getting harder and harder, isn't it?

I am writing this article a day after a shooting in Middleton WI involving someone going into their workplace and hurting people. I am writing this today as a person shot and killed people in a business in Maryland. I write this as countless others have been hurt and killed in schools and at businesses, shopping malls and movie theaters. When these occur, we are often left wondering why. I cannot say why all of these things are happening, but I am concerned that we are becoming a fearful, hurt and angry society. I believe some of this is due to our inability to rationally disagree.

I don't know about you, but I disagree with a lot of people in my life. We disagree on politics and beliefs, about ideas and opinions, we even disagree on food choices and cell phones. Yet, I still have those people in my life. Are disagreements grounds for disconnections? It may depend on the disagreement. However, I do believe we are called, as people of faith, to seek connections and community. This does not mean we must seek agreements or even common ground. This is a reality that many of us find hard to take. We do not need to agree to be respectful and loving to one another.

Sadly, “the church” has not been helpful in this debate and dilemma. Often churches require rules and conformity that hurt some in the process. Like children, we are expected to follow rules and not talk back, however, unlike children, we are often never taught how to disagree and ask questions. My children are still young, so they do not get a voice in many family decisions. However, as they grow, they will get more of a voice and an ability to disagree. This began years ago when my kids started choosing their own clothes. Grandma was not happy and believed that it was a parent's role to govern the wardrobe. We disagreed and our children have been choosing their clothing for a while. As they get older, they were allowed to choose TV programs, food options and more and more. We must model healthy disagreements. We must encourage questions and patience in answers. And we must realize that others have a choice too, which may not be our choice, but they get one none-the-less.

My heart belongs in the Moravian Church because we can disagree. That is why I get so confused when people choose to leave over decisions they do not agree with. Those decisions rarely affect us directly and do not mean that we are now “labeled” as something we are not. They are simply doors open that some may choose to walk through and others may choose not to. Both sides of the door are still Moravian.

Disagreements are part of life and help us define our own ideas or learn something of someone else. I challenge myself daily to continue discussions that may concern or confuse me and remind myself that topics are not people. It hurts my heart when friendships collapse over disagreements. Yes, there are things we value and hold dear and nobody should continue in relationships that are abusive or neglectful, ties must be cut in abusive situations. I am not advocating keeping connections when ties must be broken. I am simply stating that far too often, we let disagreements over ideas and issues hurt relationships. Jesus came to bring us into relationship with him and one another. If we truly believe that all are children of God, than we must be challenge to build relationships even with the children we do not like. This is a faith challenge we all encounter. Jesus had Judas, whom he loved even on the cross. We also have those who we are challenged by. I pray that we work, as a society, to learn healthy disagreements and aim at creating (and modeling) more community than divisions.







Packing:

From children to seniors, people pack shoebox gifts each year to bless children in need around the world. Year-round volunteers support these efforts across the country.



Collecting:

Churches and groups of all sizes collect boxes from their communities. Some churches also serve as drop-off locations for shoeboxes the third week of November every year.



Shipping:

Thousands of volunteers serve annually inspecting and preparing shoeboxes for international shipping. Every hour work stops for a few minutes to pray for the children who will receive the boxes.



Worldwide Distribution:

Long before shoeboxes arrive in more than 100 countries, volunteer National Leadership Teams train pastors and community leaders who want to share the message of the Gospel and bless children. The leaders learn how to host child-friendly outreach events, and how to implement The Greatest Journey follow-up discipleship program.



Outreach Events:

Pastors around the world host shoebox distributions in places where people may not know Christ and invite them to follow Him. Other churches use the boxes as resources for outreach in orphanages and other at-risk areas. In many places, they also offer The Greatest Gift, a Gospel story booklet Samaritan's Purse developed for shoebox recipients.



Discipleship & Multiplication:

As a result of what they learn in The Greatest Journey, boys and girls grow in Christ and share with friends and family. The students also invite others to their graduations where the Gospel is shared. This often brings parents, siblings, and friends to accept Christ and become active members in the local church. Families are reached, churches grow, new churches are started, and communities are transformed.
